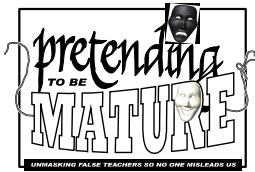

USE THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS TO HELP YOU AND YOUR FAMILY/SMALL GROUP TAKE HOME TODAY'S MESSAGE

1. Is there a “freedom” that some Christians seem to have that you don't? Or, is there a “freedom” that you have to enjoy something that some other Christians think is wrong?
2. When does the discussion of Christian freedoms oppose legalism? When does it drift into license (and perhaps licentiousness)? Which is a greater temptation for you (twisting grace to the right or to the left)?
3. In Revelation 2-3, the churches are held responsible for their actions. How can the people of a church correct false teaching like that of Balaam or the Nicolaitans or Jezebel? What role do you think the Elders should fill? The congregation?
4. Read Romans 3:7-8. Why would some accuse Paul in this way? Since we know this is a perversion of Paul's teaching, what can we learn about the difficulty of not twisting grace?
5. Review the perverted, distorted, and twisted logic behind the “questions” we looked at in Romans. Can you give any examples of people you have interacted with who have bought into these lies (if so, please don't use names)? What did you learn from interacting with them?
6. Review 1 Corinthians 6:11. What do the terms used to describe a true believer mean? How does welcoming that truth into your life help you?
7. How can we pray for you?
